RICH KID IS "HEADING TO THE TOP"

Rich Kid, Canadian based entertainer born "Richard Williams" was raised in Portmore, Jamaica and is serious about the business of Music, Arts, Entertainment, Film, Sports, Children, Philanthropy and life. JULION'S VIEWS

One more quarter passes by as Canadian Reggae continues its journey into more and more Canadian homes infiltrating more musical pallets, encouraging possible sales opportunities. In the last issue, I took the time to focus on a negative that continues to stunt this 'industry' in our collective inefficiency to sell Canadian reggae music on a consistent basis. Some folks took great offense to the words written, but truth be told, it's all good with me if folks don't share my vision or opinions in an environment where there is limited growth of our genre. It does show that we are not on the same page, so there is definitely room for growth.

Many of those who took offense completely missed the point! The one who did not miss the point was Carrie Mullings - CHRY 105.5fm, Monday mornings 10:00am -12:00pm, the only Canadian reggae show that boasts 100% Canadian playing reggae. And she does! When the lynch mob was called to rise against my words, Carrie stood firm and refused to participate in the hanging of the truth. When I asked her why she didn't get involved with criticism of my words, she shocked me with her response... She said, "You are right, I don't do enough... There are so many artists music that I don't have, many I don't know and who doesn't know of me... More needs to be done!" In case you forgot the three or so sentences before, Carrie Mullings plays 100% Canadian reggae.

As our conversation continued, we were speaking the same language. We are / were addressing the same issues of lack of sales

opportunities for Canadian reggae music and how to properly address or change that situation. One of my frustrations and queries to her was the lack of a Canadian reggae chart. So many radio personalities, so many shows, so many spins, and so many years and to my knowledge there has NEVER been an agreed nationally up. supported reggae chart. Some have tried separately at different times, but nothing on a collective basis. How does the rest of the world take us seriously if we don't do it ourselves? A chart indicates that there is something going on and that we think something of the music, so we take the time to chart it. It tells interested fans which songs and which artists are hot at the time and which tunes to buy. It tells foreign DJs which artists to contact! It creates interest for the artists who wish to rise on the charts. It increases the quality of the production and musical IT GROWS AN delivery. INDUSTRY!

Carrie went on to tell me that there will be national chart in the works and will be happening in January of 2008 and that she and a few of the personalities were in talks about the chart for some time. That made me smile! Special mention has to go out to Galaxie internet radio with Steve Neale's assistance has charting been Canadian reggae for a time now and to get that info just check out www.canadianreggaeworld.co m/Galaxie-2007-09.htm as we put up that chart as Steve sends them and to find out more about Galaxie check out www.galaxie.ca. Before I go on to sing Carrie's praises any further I pay great respect to D.B. Hawkes, formerly of CIUT 89.5fm, who propelled many live acts to notoriety at his own personal cost. Much respect to Patrick Roots, of CIUT 89.5fm, who has always opened his show to any progressive thinking artist to push themselves as well as to me personally giving CRW weekly spots to promote

Canadian reggae music consistently showing support. The King Turbo crew. CIUT, as well as Ron Nelson, CKLN 88.1fm for their pushing of Canadian based artists within their circles, Leo Cripps in Calgary playing many all-Canadian shows selling and promoting the music. Natty B of CHRY 105.5fm, who not only plays the music but promotes a Canadian reggae chart.

As we propel into the 21st century we need a greater push by many of these volunteers, to be single minded in their approach to selling Canadian. There may be a bit of resistance now, but in time they will see the opportunities that will open for all of us. As I continued to write, I thought it best that answered Carrie some questions and with those answers, would shed a little light on her credentials as well as what she is all about, and a chance for you reader/listener to aid in her continued growth if you wish to see further 'upliftment' of the Canadian reggae scene.

Q. Rhythm365.com's relationship with you...

A. I was introduced to www.rhvthm365.com thru King David while co-hosting with him on his show Positive Vibrations that airs Fridays 10 a.m. - 12 p.m. On July 29th, 2005 Tony Williams and crew came to Canada to showcase Canadian Talent and rhvthm365 DJs along with King David and myself at Club Paradise. While in Canada Mr. Williams heard a recording of the Monday morning fill-in spot I was doing that I started calling "Rebel Vibez". The "Singers in the Neighborhood" segment had him interested and with very little discussion I was linked up to a simulcast with www.rhythm365.com. We have been running the link for 28 months now. Thank you Tony Williams!

Q. Relationship and work with Montreal Reggae Festival...

A. My relationship began when two of Toronto's invited

radio personalities did not show at the festival in 2004 and the opportunity presented itself for me to fill their MC spots on the festival. It initially was a couple intros the first day but the festival Spokesperson and Host invited me to do more over the remainder of the weekend.

Q. CHRY 105.5, how long on air, how you came up with the idea for an ALL Canadian show...

A. I have been on air with CHRY since 2003. I started on Caribbean Crucible Luther Brown, G-Russ and Tipper then joined Cool Runnings with Sir B. I started filling in a TBA spot Mondays in the latter part of 2004. In 2005 the spot was given to Rebel Vibez and starting this year we changed our content which was 70% Canadian and 30% International to 100% Canadian Content. Strictly Homegrown as I like to refer to it. The idea is merely that of representing your own talent. Canada has a massive wealth talented artists musicians in our reggae industry that aren't getting the amount of airplay it takes to "BUSS" an artist. There are many reggae shows on CHRY's station but there wasn't a Canadian Reggae show, so I guess you can say I was filling a void. Rebel Vibez has been broadcasting 5 hour shows on the holidays for 2 years now. I would love to do a 5 hour broadcast weekly! Rebel Vibez is not the first to provide listeners with 5 hour broadcasts Canadian of Reggae; King David did it before I did. You know King David was the first person to share his stage with me? King David was master of ceremonies at Steele's Uncorrupted CD Launch and he handed me the microphone and encouraged me to go on stage and introduce an artist. I remember shaking and King David telling me not to be nervous I could do it and I did. Thanks King David!!

REGGAE ARTIST'S RECOV-ERY FROM ACCIDENT A 'MIR-ACLE'! MUSICIAN STILL IN HOSPITAL AFTER AUG. 18 CAR CRASH

Members of a local reggae band seriously hurt in a highway rollover three months ago are slowly recovering, with a little help from their friends. In the immediate days following the Aug. 18 crash, friends weren't sure whether Ibo would live or die. He suffered critical spinal and head injuries when the van carrying him and five other musicians left the Trans-Canada Highway near Brooks and rolled. Ibo, 44, remains in a Calgary hospital, but doctors recently removed a surgical "halo" immobilizing his head, and he is walking and talking. It's incredible how well he's doing,

considering what he's been through," said Leo Cripps, president of the Calgary International Reggae Festival. Cripps visited Ibo two weeks ago. He said Ibo's progress is a "miracle" and the musician is in good spirits. "I had a conversation with him and I wasn't expecting to," he said.

Ibo and his backing band, Kindread, were on their way to play at Calgary's reggae festival after a gig in Regina when the crash happened. Three members of Kindread were also seriously hurt, while a fifth band mate and a solo artist riding with the band escaped with cuts and bruises. The cause of the collision is still under investigation by the RCMP. Prior to striking out on his own, Ibo was a longtime member of the Calgary band Strugglah. He has toured and opened for reggae legends like the Wailers and Jimmy Cliff. lbo also contributed music to what is believed to be the first Canadian reggae compilation, which came out earlier this vear. More than half the proceeds from sales of the \$25 disk are going toward helping lbo and his band mates through their recuperation and rehabilitation. Another friend of Ibo's said it's not yet known how quickly and to what extent he'll regain all his faculties. The friend, speaking on condition of anonymity, said Ibo is facing between three and six months of rehabilitation. 

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

REGGAEXCLUSIVE REASONS WITH THE ORIGINAL SINGJAY TONY REBEL

eggaeX: Greetings Tony, welcome to Toronto at Rastafest 2007. Thank you for the wonderful show last night. You also performed at Reggaefest in Montreal. How was that?

Tony Rebel: Montreal Reggaefest was fantastic! We didn't get enough time but the time that we did have was utilised properly and the audience loved it! The audience was huge. Canada is wonderful. Canada is a beautiful place especially in the summer. The people are fine too. It is always one of our favourite places.

ReggaeX: You've been in the music business for many years and you are seen as an innovator, an originator of the singjay style. How does it feel to be an innovator in Reggae?

Tony Rebel: Well it always a warm feeling to know that something that stands out in earth could really come through you. Such a good foundation. It is always a good thing. The new wave of culture singers that came in the 90's. I don't want to say I am responsible for it but I was used as an instrument to establish it. I realize that being a Dj which I love so much if you just dj your songs without a melody it could get monotonous sometimes so I decided to put a little melody with it and see if I could bring some sweetness to that hardcore so it was more on the cutting edge, so the singjay was coined.

ReggaeX: Your song writing abilities are so strong and you have so many hits. When you are writing your songs does it ever occur to you that you have a hit on your hands?

Tony Rebel: Yes definitely. A few times there are a few surprises but usually I know. When I got the inspiration for Jah by my side I knew. I was driving about 1 am and I went and woke up my brother and I said look we have to tape this. I said this song is really a hit song.

ReggaeX: Many of your songs have become Reggae anthems like Jah is by my side, Fresh Vegetable, Know Jah.

Tony Rebel: It's good to have songs that are a staple everywhere in the world. I can always expect a good response.

ReggaeX: You know it's really huge when you have to release it in French and Spanish!

Tony Rebel: (Laughter)
Definitely! It's always a good vibe when you have those masterpieces, then if you don't get a chance to record anymore you can always use those. People will always want to hear those. The Reggae market is very huge all over the world.

ReggaeX: Can you tell ReggaeXclusive readers about your volunteer work in Jamaica?

Tony Rebel: In terms of doing voluntary service, I have been doing that from a youth but since I became popular it became more pronounced. After a while I became the President of Artistes Against Aids and I was a part of and still am a part of Committee for Communities. I wrote a song for the United Nations in the vear of the volunteer. It was the chosen song in the midst of over 30 countries I actually went to the United Nations hall of assembly in Manhattan and

did it in front of Kofi Anan and the Prince of Spain and President of Zambia, actually he was the one who introduced me on stage. So it was a good vibe. Also Harry Bellefonte came to Jamaica one time to help to sensitise the people of the Caribbean about the deadly disease. Aids. That is when we formed the triple organization of Artistes Against Aids of which I am the chairperson. So it is not all about getting. You have to give back and sometimes when you give of yourself that is when you truly give. It's not all about money even though there is a time for the dollar sign. We have to always make sure that we do what we can do. I think that is the whole purpose of human beings is to preserve earth and preserve life and to live for our fellow humans.

ReggaeX: You have quite a great group of people around you with Flames Productions, your Reggae family.

Tony Rebel: Yes mon. From long-time Garnett Silk used to be at Flames, Everton Blender, Ras Shiloh and many more. Now we have Queen Ifrica, one of our latest products. She is taking off in the music scene, and the music world. We never do it selfishly; we always try to bring somebody in.

ReggaeX: Is producing other artistes something that you will continue to do?

Tony Rebel: Yes mon. I produced a song with Queen Ifrica and Gentleman, Ritchie Spice, Luciano and on and on.

ReggaeX: What is new and fresh coming out right now?

Tony Rebel: Right now Queen Ifrica's album is just out. It's called Fyah Muma and we're promoting that. Also, my album I Rebel is out and we're promoting that. There's a new song that I have called Love fyah on the Baltimore riddim, I just did it for Sly and Robbie. I just came back from Europe for two weeks hit all the major festivals from Germany, where we did Reggae Summer Jam. We did Rotterdam and Italy, and we did another festival in Belgium, Portugal... We keep on working, moving out there and delivering the message. Recording at the same time. I'm trying to complete my recording studio. I have a little one but I am trying to complete another one that is more comfortable where I can do more work. You will see more of our production coming forth.

ReggaeX: You have made a lot of people happy over the years with your music. Your performance last night at Rastafest here in Toronto was outstanding. These types of events are very consciousness raising. How did Rebel Salute come about?

Tony Rebel: Rebel Salute came about as a Birthday or Earthday on the 15th of January. So because I don't drink alcohol I don't sell any. My music is about inspiration and motivation. So we as the artistes provide that for the people. It's a spiritual It's like a renaissance. pilgrimage at the beginning of the year. The people help to inspire the continuation of it The people love it.

ReggaeX: You are living by example of what Rasta livity is really supposed to be. By rejecting the alcohol and showing people the conscious way.

Tony Rebel: Well definitely. If you don't use certain things, I don't see why you should be selling it either. Even though we could get millions of dollars we don't accept it, we will not sell that product. We can't be bribed. If you fall for that you will fall for anything.

ReggaeX: Keep up the good works! Where are you off to next?

Tony Rebel: I'm going back to Jamaica, just chilling til I go back to Europe.

ReggaeX: Tony, Toronto loves you and the whole Reggae world loves you! Thank you so much for doing what you do and for just being you.

Tony Rebel: Thank you and keep publishing the good works. Jah Bless.



ReggaeXclusive: Welcome to Calgary Reggaefest 007. We're very happy to have you here, such a great international act in our city.

Richie Stephens: Thank You!

ReggaeX: You've been known as Jamaica's Golden voice now for decades. How was your career before that, going back to your first big break?

R S: Well I started out a long time ago. I've been a community entertainer for a number of years. Then home being just eighteen miles form Negril, back then was the show capital of the world. So I used to get the opportunity to go down to Negril to sing on stage shows every now and again. But the real big break came back in 1987 when I did my first recording. I've actually been in the game since 1984. That makes it 24 years.

ReggaeX: You've become a household name in Jamaica, and in places like Europe. How has your reception been the U.S and Canada?

R S: It's great. As you can image the West Indian community is very big there. In Canada it's basically the same thing. Last week's show, the people really got what they came for!

ReggaeX: In Toronto?

RS: Yeah at the Waterfront. I, Sugar Minott and Freddie McGregor were there. It was a nice vibe. So I am happy to say and I give thanks everyday to know that it is established in many parts of the world that people listen to Reggae music.

ReggaeX: Is there anywhere

you would like to break into the market that you haven't yet?

R S: I'd really love to break into the market in all those places where Reggae is not established yet. The world is a big market and if you can tap into it here there and everywhere you can do more shows and make more money. So I'd love to tap into any market where Reggae music in not popular.

ReggaeX: I understand you're involved in events in Jamaica, such as the Take Me Away Charity concerts. How and when did that all get started?

R S: The Take Me Away concerts basically stated in 1995. The last one we did was the third one. Proceeds from that show go towards charity. It's been going strong. People really support that type of event based on the nature of it. It didn't start there for me as far as charity is concerned. It started way back in 1991 with a show called Unity Splash, a show that gives back to my community and to communities outside of my home town as well. So I've been doing charity for a long time but more recently, a lot of people started to discover that I've been into charity based on the fact that I have adopted a golden age home for the aged and have been doing work that has come to the attention of the media.

ReggaeX: I understand you were recognized for your efforts being given the Humanitarian Award in 2006.

R S: Yes. I got that award from different organizations but I was given that one lately by the F.I.U (Florida International University). It's really nice to be awarded for the things that you are doing. An award to me is not really what I am looking for. I always say to my friends I look forward to my reward from God. That is my main motivation for what I am doing. But Awards are appreciated! Recently I received one of the most prestigious awards from the Governor General of Jamaica. That ward has nothing to do with music but for some of the work I've done in and out of my community. There are several awards that I have been getting and again I thank God for the recognition. Not only

for me, but by being awarded then the work that I am doing is now highlighted and that is how I can influence other people to get involved because there is absolutely nothing wrong with it!

ReggaeX: Definitely! Coming back to the music here, who are some of the artistes that you admire?

R S: In terms of music?

ReggaeX: Musically and otherwise.

R S: Put it this way, I am a supporter of good talent and decent behaviour of each human being. So those of who live up to those standards, I respect them. So many artistes are doing well in those respects so I can't pick just one or two! I'm a supporter of many artistes that are living up!

ReggaeX: Who inspires you?
R S: Dennis Brown is the first artiste that I identified with as a youngster coming up. I admire his style, voice, melodies, and his words over the years so he is my main inspiration. But I listen to all the greats, Bob Marley, Luther Vandross, Patty LaBelle.

ReggaeX: How many albums have you released to date?

R S: To date, thirteen albums.

ReggaeX: After having a lot of commercial success on your albums, what prompted you to start your own label?

R S: Well they say God Bless the child that has his own. (laughter) It was a great move for me at the time. Based on the level of piracy and all the different technologies that allow people to access music easily and put a big pressure on the record companies it makes independent distribution and selling music on the internet become more popular now. I give thanks to know I'm creating my own with an independent label. It keeps me going on an on. I can create an album any time I want. Good music never dies!

ReggaeX: If you weren't Ritchie Stevens the singer, who would you be?

R S: You tell me! (laughter) I try to figure that out all the time! I honestly can't come up with

who I'd be because I've never had a nine to five. I can't say I'd be a carpenter or a doctor. It's just always been music for me!

ReggaeX: Clearly your destiny!

R.S: Yes!

ReggaeX: Where have you been touring recently?

RS: I've been really busy doing a lot of shows this summer. Last week I did a show in Toronto, and then I went to San Francisco to do a big show called the Reggae Rising. That was a major festival with about 40,000 people. Then we went to L.A. and then back to Jamaica now I'm back in Calgary to do the Reggae Festival, after that I go to New York and then back to Jamaica. I'm looking forward to going to Japan this year, Europe next year and the Caribbean always. You can just Island hop!

ReggaeX: Where do you get the inspiration to write such great songs like Joy and Weakness for Sweetness?

RS: Well it comes naturally for me. I could be sitting here talking to you and all of a sudden a melody comes out in my head. If I feel it enough I will probably put it down on a dictaphone like this or ignore the melody and if I wake up tomorrow and still feel it I know I must do something about it. I might be just talking to someone and they say something and it just clicks and there goes a song. I might be talking to a beautiful girl like you and by talking to her there goes a nice song. (laughter)

ReggaeX: You are known for your highly energetic stage performances. Is that always the way you perform?

RS: That is a natural part of me. I like to sweat when I'm on stage! I am not the kind of vocalist that concentrates on notes when I'm on stage. I love to run all over the place. I prefer to give you a good show rather than a perfect vocal performance.



ReggaeX: The Reggae music industry is strong in many places like Jamaica, Europe and Japan. What do you think is needed to expand it?

RS: I think us as an industry need to take a look at promoting our music and us more. Not necessarily treat all the performances like a show. in other words some gigs don't pay much money but they are promoting the music. Like for instance there is a new market developing in South America and some of the promoters are not able to pay the money that the bigger markets are able to pay. Some artistes probably don't want to go because they don't feel they are getting paid enough. But I would say to them, sometimes ignore the amount of money so you can sow the seeds that you will reap somewhere down the line. By going there the music gets bigger and more popular, starts playing in the homes. The kids will accept it more. So those are some of the areas that we need to look into as an industry. va understand?

ReggaeX: For sure. Is there anything you'd like your fans to know about you that they may

not already know?

RS: (laughter) Well I believe in reinventing myself. I've been in the game for a long time but I'm not one of those artistes that is just comfortable with myself. I'm still trying to write better songs and still trying to produce better and make every performance better. If you see me ten times before and then vou see me tomorrow then I want to impress you in a way that you will say wow he's gotten better. So I'm always putting out an effort in what I'm doing.


ReggaeX: So what do you have in store for your fans at Reggaefest tomorrow?
